Our History

Up until the early 1970's, South Chicago was a prosperous and sustainable community thanks to a bustling steel industry that provided jobs, commerce and accessible healthcare in the community. After the systemic decline of steel mills and factories in the area, residents not only lost their jobs but access to vital health services and programs went with it. The Claretian priests of the neighboring Our Lady of Guadalupe Church addressed this demand by working with local agencies and community residents to build a fundamental health safety net that would meet the critical healthcare needs of the thousands of community residents affected by the exodus of the steel industry in South Chicago. The Claretian Medical Center opened in 1977 on East 91st Street with a staff of four and cared for 400 patients that year, marking the beginning of CFHC as we know it today. CFHC Receives The Joint Commission Accreditation

Chicago Family Health Center has earned The Joint Commission's Gold Seal of Approval for Ambulatory Health Care Accreditation for demonstrating continuous compliance with their nationally recognized standards across our five health centers. The Gold Seal of Approval is a symbol of quality that reflects an organization's commitment to providing safe and effective patient care.



In December a team of Joint Commission surveyors evaluated our compliance with ambulatory care standards in a variety of areas, including coordination of care, infection prevention and control, medication management and patient education and training. Our staff worked diligently for over a year preparing to meet the standards required to be aligned with The Joint Commission, the premier healthcare quality improvement and accrediting body in the nation.

The level of care our patients receive will be forever impacted by this achievement and our work to maintain Accreditation has only just begun as we continue develop and improve our quality and safety goals for our patients and communities.

We are Still Growing



Today CFHC cares for nearly 30,000 patients a year through a network of [five health](#)

[center sites](#) in South Chicago, Pullman, East Side, Roseland and Chicago Lawn. Our services are coordinated with a comprehensive approach to care for patients in need of **Medical, Dental, Behavioral Health and support programs** . We have more than 250 employees including upwards of **25 Providers** who specialize in family and internal medicine, pediatrics, cardiology, OB/GYNE, dental and behavioral health. We also have a dedicated team of nurses, caseworkers and clinical staff working together to ensure all health needs are being met.

Program Spotlight: Dramatic Performance Improvement Collaborative

Ask patients what they dread about a doctor's visit and they'll likely say it's the long visit times. Ask a healthcare worker what they dread and they'll say it's patient no-shows. CFHC recently concluded a Dramatic Performance Improvement (DPI) Collaborative, a one-year initiative focused on improving the patient and staff experience through structure, intensive training and workflow changes. The process encouraged teamwork and eliminated silos among staff and the results were impressive. In one year CFHC saw a no-show rate reduction of 46% and a 40% reduction in appointment cycle time system-wide. The DPI Collaborative practices will continue to further increase patient and employee satisfaction levels.
